Question 1A from Study Guide 1 : Comprehension

Menzi Ngubane is a peaceful and talented South African actor best known for his role as Sibusiso Dlomo, or Ngamla.

Menzi was born in Ladysmith and never considered acting in his life.

In fact, it was his mother who told him he needed to be an actor because "when he told stories it made people feel like they were there".

Menzi took up acting just to please his mom and in the process found his real calling.

His mother liked telling him stories. He can't forget his mother telling him the story of an eagle:



Did you know my boy? "she said" The Eagle is a brave, intelligent, courageous, powerful and beautiful bird. It can live longer than many birds in the world. It can live up to 70 years; but to reach this age, the eagle must make a hard decision when it reaches the 40th year.

Its long nails called talons can no longer hold other animals which serves as its food. Its long and sharp beak becomes bent. It's old-aged and heavy wings, due to their thick feathers, stick to it's chest and make it difficult to fly.

Then the eagle will wait for a new beak to grow back and then it will break its hard nails, the talons.

When it's new talons grow back, the eagle starts removing it's old-aged feathers.

And after 5 months, the eagle would start a new life a fly as high as the young eagle and lives for 30 more years. For it to look younger, the eagle needs change.

"Why is change needed my boy?" asked Sibusiso's mom after telling the story. Many times, in order to survive we have to start a change process. We sometimes need to get rid of old memories, habits and other past traditions. Only freed from past burdens, can we take advantage of the present.
